Dr. Shyamal K. Das, MBBS, MD, DM, FIAN.

Fifth of the six siblings, Shyamal Kumar Das was born in a small village Dania Khali weaver's family of Distt. Hugli, West Bengal, who with amazing parenting and wonderful intellectual capabilities after medical graduation entered PGIMER Chandigarh and qualified MD General Medicine and DM Neurology in mid-1985. Being my batch mate, I had close association with such a simple, straight-forward, hardworking, ground to earth personality who despite all odds was full of empathy for his patients, colleagues, students and

truthful to actualisation. Married to a sweet loving caring lady Roma, he was blessed with a daughter, Surma, now a Professor in Law and Political Science and a son, Sidhharath who has finished training in bio-instrumentation.

With his illustrious carrier, weaving best threads between teacher and taught, among peer groups, patients, family, social commitments Shyamal Da adopted need-based medical services and R&D. His work in Neuro-epidemiology, movement disorders, aging brain and other fields of clinical neurology led to 256 research items with 4605 citation, became the 2nd Prof and Head Department of Neurology Bangur Medical College Kolkata and President of Alzheimer and related Disorder Society of India, Calcutta Chapter.

Exit from the existential flow was rather early when few days back Shyamal da had a massive intra-cranial bleed and we lost a good human, a friend, a doctor par excellence neuro-scientist on 5th August 2018.

This is a great loss to all members of Indian Academy of Neurology, to me specifically as his meaningful ways of living life always, never in ego trap haunted me. Shyamal Da has left us all, however his values, and ideas will always be remembered with warmth and making a roadmap for becoming a good neurologist. Good people like Shyamal Da accept our condolences with good words like:

Just close your eyes and you will see , All the memories that you have of me;

Just sit and relax and you will find, I'm really still there inside your mind;

Don't cry for me now I'm gone, For I am in the land of songs;

There is no pain, there is no fear, So dry away that silent tear;

Don't think of me in the dark and cold, For here I am, no longer old;

I'm in that place that's filled with love, Known to you all, as "up above";

We do all stand by against all odds to the aggrieved family always.

World Brain Day, July 22, 2018

Nagpur, Maharashtra:

Dr. Chandrashekhar Meshram organized a meeting of neurologists, neurosurgeons, psychiatrists and other social groups to plan the World Brain Day celebration. Press note was released on 21st July. Public education program on air pollution and Brain health was arranged on 22nd July. The Program was inaugurated by renowned actor and psychiatrist Dr Mohan Agashe. An Artist and President of Basoli group of children was the guest of honor. Mayor of Nagpur, Mr. Nandatai Jichkar also attended the event. Dr. Chandrashekhar Meshram delivered a talk on air pollution and the brain and highlighted the importance of world brain day and public education activities. He also explained the natural and man made causes of air pollution and effects of air pollution on brain. He mentioned that out of 15 most polluted cities in the world, 14 are from India. He suggested that nation-wide campaign for clean air is the need of the hour. The event was attended by 500 people.

This was followed by screening of national award winning educative movie "Astu" based on dementia. After the movie, Dr Mohan Aga, interacted with the audience and explained the finer details about dementia and role of care giver.

Dr. Chandrashekhar Meshram gave a interview on All India Radio, explaining various aspects of air pollution including effects on brain and means for reducing the air pollution. World Brain Day posters were displayed in prominent places in city including hospitals and clinics. Print media carried the campaign with great interest and there were 14 publications in various newspapers in English, Hindi and Marathi languages.

Nellore, Tamil Nadu:

Dr. Bindu Menon Foundation, Apollo Speciality hospitals and Jain Hub participated in world brain day event on 22nd July. The theme "Clean Air for Healthy brain" was propagated. As Vehicles contribute a great deal to the air pollution, a cycle rally was organized which started from the main ground of Nellore VRC centre and went all across the town.

A press meet was organized prior to the cycle rally. Prof Bindu Menon Senior Neurologist addressed the meeting and emphasized the need for clean air for a healthy brain. Among the various forms of air pollution, Dr. Bindu Menon emphasized that vehicle induced pollution is a major contributor for air pollution. Encouraging the public to use cycle especially youngsters and switch to pedal power. A clean air is essential to prevent several diseases including Brain Stroke and degenerative disorders.
